At Weston Favell Academy, we place high value on attendance and encourage our pupils to attend every day. The minimum target for every pupil is 96%.

To demonstrate our support, we have heavily invested in attendance rewards with the aim of motivating pupils and recognising their positive attitude to high attendance.

Our strategy is now embedded and rewards and now in place for weekly:

- 100% attendance
- Tutor group 'highest attendance' award
- Tutor group 'most progress' award

We also complete an attendance draw at the end of each term; pupils will receive one entry for every week of 100% attendance within that term.

Some of our pupils had 7 entries this term and 378 remain on 100% attendance for the year to date!

Our winners chose prizes including a BMX bike, a Nintendo Switch with Super Mario game, Premier League football, NBA basketball, karaoke machine, JBL Bluetooth speaker, driving lessons, Lego sets, vouchers and much more.

Sleighing in Science








Our Year 7 Football Team achieved WFA's first win of the season in last week's match against NIA.
